**PARKWAY TREES** If you are a resident of Park Ridge, the City of Park Ridge has 3 ways for residents to get (between the sidewalk and the curb). Questions: contact the Forestry Division.

**Complimentary Tree Program** - The Forestry Division regularly plants parkway trees completely free of cost to residents. All vacant parkway sites, including sites that previously had trees removed, are eligible for complimentary tree planting. Complimentary trees are planted during our regular May and October planting events as inventory allows. Residents are notified via mail that a parkway tree will be planted before the start of our planting event. Species for complimentary plantings are at the discretion of the Forestry Division.

**Share-the-Cost Program** - The Forestry Division offers residents the ability to “share the cost” of planting for new parkway trees. A share of \$140 per tree allows residents to select their tree from our available species list for planting. Any resident who recently had a parkway tree removed will automatically receive an application via mail, or residents can request an application by contacting the Public Works Administration Office. Applications are mailed in January and July for May and October planting.

**Right-of-Way Permits** - To plant a parkway tree independently, residents must obtain a Right-of-Way Permit. Applications can be submitted online on the Forestry page of the City website, or in person at the Public Works Administration Office at City Hall. Forestry Staff will review your application and determine if the proposed tree is of appropriate size and species. If you plan to use a contractor to plant a tree in the parkway, the City’s contractor registration requirements must be met prior to permit issuance.
